Aim of the APC


The APC is a course to become aware of the theory, the psychological aspects and the philosophical background of Sherborne Developmental Movement, and the connection with Laban and child development.

This Course has been agreed by the International body (ISCO) and participants will receive a Certificate of APC Sherborne after successfully achieving the standard required from the 3-day, residential course.

The aim of the course is to give participants a broader and deeper understanding of both the theory and practice of Sherborne Developmental Movement.
